

Danube Strategy in 2014-2020

- Robust integrated cooperation framework
- Improve effectiveness and impact of EU policies
- Utilize all available programs and instruments
- Set of common challenges structured according to sectors
- Process driven by PACs (international) and NCPs (national and regional)
- Three principles:
 - i. better coordination of existing policies and funds,
 - ii. better use of existing institutions, and
 - iii. better implementation of existing legislation

Embedding the Strategy in the Operational Programs 2014-2020







The Operational Programs are characterized by:

- 1. More FOCUS 11 thematic objectives
 - Research & innovation
 - Information and communication technologies (ICT)
 - Competitiveness of Small and Medium-sized Enterprises (SMEs)
 - Shift towards a low-carbon economy
 - Climate change adaptation & risk prevention and management
 - ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION & RESOURCE EFFICIENCY
 - Sustainable transport & removing bottlenecks in key network infrastructures
 - Employment & supporting labour mobility
 - Social inclusion & combating poverty
 - Education, skills & lifelong learning
 - Institutional capacity building & efficient public administrations
- 2. but also more FLEXIBILITY
 - Less programs
 - Harmonized set of rules
 - Various implementation instruments and tools to help you finance and implement you project

Tools

- 1. ETC Transnational Cooperation Programs
 - Danube Transnational Cooperation Program
 - o 14 countries (EU, non-EU), Danube Strategy geography
 - Est. 200 MEUR; 85% co-financing (+ national?)
 - Programming is still ongoing in OP programming Task Force
 - Thematic Objectives not yet selected (TO4, 6, 7,?)
 - o Danube Strategy support mechanism discussed
 - Approval expected in summer 2014
 - First call expected in late 2014/early 2015
 - o Assumably similar conditions to SEE program

• CENTRAL Program

- Continuation of previous programme
- Similar budget and conditions
- 2. ETC Cross-border Cooperation Programs
 - Bilateral or smaller multilateral cooperation programs
 - EU, non-EU (IPA, ENI countries)
 - Programming of OPs still ongoing; approval by summer 2014
 - Danube Strategy objectives, projects taken into account
 - Budget varies according to border length, country allocation, etc. (in HU 20-160 MEUR est.)
 - Thematic Objectives currently being slected (TO4,6,7,?)
 - 85% co-financing + national co-financing (?)
 - Cross-border impact!
- 3. Sustainable Growth and Jobs Programs (EU national programs)
 - Sectorial OPs (Environment, Energy, Economic Development) and Regional OPs
 - Planning is ongoing; final approval expected in early 2014
 - Danube Strategy approach, objectives and projects taken into account
 - Identify priorities where there is need for cooperation
 - Possibility to implement cooperation projects between countries and programs:
 - Cooperation tools (joint platforms, EGTC, etc.)
 - o Territorial flexibility rules (finance outside program area)
 - Specific calls for tender (strategic projects, geographical/thematic limitation, etc.)
- Functional regions are more important than administrative borders → good news for international river basins!
- 4. Other programs and instruments
 - IPA
 - ENI
 - EU centrally managed programs (LIFE+, Horizon2020)
 - Other ETC programs
 - Financial Engineering Instruments
 - TA/PP facilities
 - EIB instruments, pre- and co-financing, advisory services
 - Etc.



DRS project implementation scheme supported by BDCP



- 1. Identification of
 - project, concept, functional region
 - promoter, stakeholders
 - level of commitment
 - management risk
- 2. Plausibility check
 - Plausibility check: content, fact finding, fitting into EU/national objectives, etc.)
 - **Commitment** check: partners/stakeholders committed? financing needed?
 - Is it based on **real needs**? Are the objectives well defined?
 - What has already been done and what is undergoing?
 - Capitalization, Innovation, Synergies
 - Is there a clear **need for cooperation**? What **added value** does it bring?
 - What is the easiest, most efficient and cost effective way to cooperate?
 - Recommendation for approval: yes, no, clarifications
- 3. formal SG approval
 - Meet macro-regional conditionality (targets, actions, roadmaps)
 - Issue formal SG approval based on well-funded facts →effect on financing decisions in 2014-2020
- 4. Pre-implementation
 - Kick-off meeting and detailed fact finding
 - Formalized cooperation framework (negotiate, sign)
 - Prepare study (feasibility)
 - Highlight main issues and obstacles: management, legal, environmental, technical
- 5. Implementation
 - Financial engineering; bring into programming 2014-2020
 - Is there a need for joint planning, decision making, funding, implementation?
 - What is the most suitable tool?
 - Technical/strategic assistance: steer the project and keep the ball rolling
- 6. Follow-up
 - Lessons learned
 - Use results, knowledge in other projects
 - Transfer knowledge to similar regions
