- Coordination of implementation of the **11 Priority Area**s by two **Priority Area Coordinator** (PAC) from two countries.
- Bavaria (Bavarian State Ministry for the Environment and Consumer Protection) together with Croatia (Ministry for Environment and Nature Protection) is PAC for Priority Area 6: Preserving biodiversity, landscapes and the quality of air and soils

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Targets of Priority Area 06

PRIORITY AREA 6

Preserving biodiversity, landscapes and the quality of air and soils

Targets of Priority Area 6

- To halt the deterioration in the status of all species and habitats covered by EU nature legislation and achieve a significant and measurable improvement, adapted to the special needs of the Danube Region by 2020.
- By 2020, ecosystems and their services are maintained and enhanced by establishing green infrastructure and restoring at least 15% of degraded ecosystems, including degraded soils.
- By 2020, Invasive Alien Species and their pathways are identified and prioritised, priority species are controlled or eradicated, and pathways are managed to prevent the introduction and establishment of new IAS.
- Secure viable populations of **Danube sturgeon species and other indigenous fish species** by 2020.





Tasks of the PACs

Implementation of the EUSDR by the PACs

- Coordination
 - Take up ideas, networking with relevant actors in the Danube Region.
- Concentration
 - Consolidation of implementation activities in the Danube Region for raising efficiency
- Integration
 - horizontal = cross-sectoral cooperation via platform EUSDR vertical = connection to policy level
- **Implementation** of the EUSDR generally by projects and single activities, funded by EU- and national funding programmes.













Implementation of the EUSDR

Examples for activities of PA 06

- Bavarian Stakeholder-Network, Development of a Masterplan for securing and development of biodiversity at Bavarian stretch of the Danube River.
- Initiation of international **Danube Sturgeon Task Force DSTF** with members from science, NGO's, intern. Organizations and public authorities. Elaboration of Strategy and Action Plan "**Sturgeon 2020**" with comprehensive Work Plan for implementation.
- Networking of protected areas alongside Danube River
 DANUBEPARKS, development of follow-up activities.
- Danube Region Invasive Alien Species Network DIAS
- Close **cooperation** with other Priority Areas (e.g. PA1a, PA4, PA5...)











Implementation of the EUSDR – current situation

Benefits provided by the EUSDR on project level

Strengths:

- High political awareness and back-up for EUSDR-projects.
- Push and thrust for several initiatives and activities.
- Strategic approach, potentially higher impact and visibility of project results
- Horizontal and vertical integration enables several synergy effects.
- Equal importance of all Priority Areas.
- EUSDR as platform for new integrative solutions and measures.

Weaknesses:

- Complexity of the EUSDR.
- diffuse funding opportunities for projects.
