



# LIFE 2018-2020 MAWP- Remaining Budget

- Remaining allocation for MAWP2: €1.66 billion
  - €1,24 billion for ENV Sub-programme (mean: €413 million/year)
  - €0,41 billion for CLIMA Sub-programme (mean: €137 million/year)











### LIFE Mid-Term Evaluation recommendations

- Simplifying grant management procedure, in particular the application and reporting processes;
- Increasing the strategic focus of the demand-driven part of the programme, e.g. by targeting topics not covered by the projects funded in previous years\*;
- Doing more to reproduce the projects and transfer of their results, e.g. by developing the capacity to plan and implement investments and addressing the lack of financial resources;
- Improving the communication strategy to better target audiences, deliver more objective-specific and target-specific key messages and ensure more structured coordination between players.









## LIFE 2014-2020 – Geographical Coverage

### Principle:

Applicable where the Treaty on European Union applies

### Participation:

- Certain Third Countries may participate on the basis of and in line with the conditions of a cooperation agreement
- Cooperation with International Organisations is possible when necessary to reach LIFE objectives











### Activities outside of the EU

#### May be included if:

- Necessary to achieve Union environmental or climate objectives
- Necessary to ensure the effectiveness of interventions carried out in the Member States' territories to which the Treaties apply
- The Coordinating Beneficiary is established in the EU











### LIFE - General features

- Applicants Companies, research institutes, NGOs, public administrations active in the field of environment and climate protection; all legal persons registered in the EU
- Emphasis on replicability/transferability, long-term sustainability, and an EU added value of the project results
- Not focused on research (→H2020)
- No large infrastructure; not focused on rural or regional development
  agricultural, structural funds)
- Support and monitoring: from Contracting Authority (EASME or European Commission) and external monitoring team











### LIFE General features

- Funding rate: in general, 55% of eligible costs in the MAWP 2018-2020;
- Actors: EASME for all grants except preparatory projects, and;
  EIB/intermediary banks for financial instruments; intervention of NCPs only if desired
- National allocations: do not apply in MAWP 2018-2020.











### The "traditional" projects

#### For whom?

· All legal persons registered in the EU

#### For what?

- Pursuit of general and specific objectives of the 6 priority areas
- Sub-programme for environment: additional focus on thematic priorities and on project topics (LIFE Multi-Annual Work Programme for 2018-2020)

#### Average size?

1 to 5 beneficiaries; EU contribution: €500,000 to €1.5 million

#### Co-funding rate?

- Max. 55%, at two exceptions:
  - NAT/BIO projects: max. 60%
  - NAT/BIO projects under specific conditions linked to conservation actions on priority habitat/ species: max.75%











# Integrated projects (IPs)

#### For whom?

 Public administration and other entities active in the field of environment and climate protection and capable of coordinating, besides the IP, complementary actions co-funded by additional private, public (preferably EU) funds

#### For what?

 Implementing Union environmental and climate plans and strategies (Art. 2D of the Regulation); big scale; complementary actions with additional co-funding; involvement of stakeholders

#### Average size?

 2 to 10 beneficiaries; EU contribution: €10 to 15 million; about 3 IPs per Member State

### Co-funding rate?

• 60%











## Technical Assistance Project (TAs)

#### For whom?

 For those who would like to submit an Integrated Project, but need assistance in finalising the application

#### For what?

 Support in drafting the IP application; can be applied for a year before the intended IP or in the same year

#### Average size?

 Maximum 1% of the yearly budget for IPs is allocated to TAs; maximum EU contribution per TA is €100,000

### Co-funding rate?

• 60%











# Preparatory projects (PRE)

#### For whom?

 Public sector, NGOs, private agencies involved in the wider environmental and climate change sector

#### For what?

- Supporting specific needs for the implementation of the EU environmental and climate policy and legislation
- Each year Member States receive a draft list of specific needs and can comment it;
  based on this feedback, a final list is established

### Range of Preparatory project budget in MAWP1

€250,000 - €1,200,000

#### Co-funding rate?

• 60%

# New feature: Financial support to third parties as part of a LIFE traditional project

LIFE projects may budget financial support to third parties in order to assist entities outside the project partnership (e.g. non-profit organisations, local authorities or citizens groups) in the implementation or development of local initiatives that will contribute to the project's objectives.

#### Max 100K€ (200K€ for IPs) per project and 20K€ per initiative

Applicants should explain:

- · The rationale and results expected;
- How they will manage the process (e.g. criteria to select the entity);
- List types of activities for which third party may receive financial support.












# Fact 1: There is significant competition for LIFE funds

ENV + NAT + GIE - Submitted CN by Member State










# Thematic analysis: Invited CNs

### Environment and resource efficiency














### Call 2019: Climate Sub-Programme: applications submitted by Member State











### Fact 2: You can't get a grant if you don't submit an application

- Two application procedures for the 2020 call:
  - two-stage approach based on a concept note followed by a full proposal – Sub-Programme ENV
  - one-stage approach based only on a full proposal Sub-Programme CLIMATE ACTION

## Priority area ENV-Resource efficiency (II)

- · Five sectors:
  - Water, including marine and coastal environment
  - Waste
  - Resource efficiency, including soil and forest, green and circular economy
  - Environment and health, including chemicals and noise
  - Air quality and emissions, incl. urban environment
- Thematic priorities within these five sectors are described in the Annex III of the LIFE Regulation
- New projects topics are defined in the MAWP 2018-2020 projects that clearly and fully fit under the topics get extra points during the evaluation (AW5: 5 points)
