Visegrad Fund in a nutshell


- Founded in 2000 by the Declaration of the V4 Prime Ministers
- Mission: to strengthen the ties of the V4 and to develop the cooperation between their non governmental institutions in the field of culture, education, science and research, tourism, cross border cooperation and youth exchange
- Desicion-making: CA-CM unanimous
- Budget: 8 million, 10 mil. from 2022 on
- Seat: Bratislava


6000 grant projects implemented and almost 3000 individual scholars and residents supported

FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES: VISEGRAD GRANTS

Projects must develop meaningful cooperation and active participation of organizations from at least 3 V4 countries

Projects must address at least one of the objectives of the grant program's seven focus areas Application
submission by one of
the Open Call
deadlines
1 February / 1 June /
1 October of the given
year.

Grants can cover up to 100% of project budget with 15% for overheads

FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES: VISEGRAD+ GRANTS

Projects which contribute to the democratization and transformation processes in the Eastern Partnership countries.

Active involvement of at least 3 V4 countries + an entity from the Eastern Partnership countries at minimum.

100% of project
budget with maximum
15% of the requested
sum for overheads

Maximum duration of project implementation is 18 months

Training of V4 Farmers in Techniques for Environmental Protection and Soil Water Management

Lectures for farmers on environmentally sound bio waste treatment and rational application of agro technical measures, which can significantly increase water retention, reduce erosion, and desertification and be a significant factor in reducing the negative effects of ongoing climate change and drought.




V4 PROJECTS

From Reforestation to Water Resilience in Visegrad countries

Harmony of Culture Foundation

Selected partners from each Visegrad countries were invited to learn about water retention techniques and spread the knowledge about water earthworks, along with few other participants (mostly farmers) from nearby countries. They learn to understand the principles of permaculture design in earthworks: reading the site, interpreting contour maps and using surveying tools.
