- 64,000 participants, from 160 countries
 - 278 sessions and 254 Expo and Fair booths
 - 2 Plenary sessions: Head of States
 - 20 Priority sessions: High-level panels
 - 103 Theme sessions, covering 30 topics
 - 21 Political segments
 - 29 regional sessions
 - 55 sideevents

Thematics

1. **Water security and prosperity:** Launch of green infrastructure compact and global multisector hub
2. **Water for Human and Nature:** investment in NBSs in Africa, inclusion of water in climate agenda
3. **Disaster Risk Reduction and Management:** “Early warning systems for all”
4. **Governance, Cooperation and Hydrodiplomacy:** Water governance at main global events, OECD report on Blue Economy, Leave no one Behind campaign
5. **Sustainable Finance:** Diversifying mechanisms in collective actions, blended finance
6. **Knowledge and Innovation:** Task force to set up Community of Practice, Africa Knowledge Hub, Greater Inclusion

1. Ministerial Declarations

- d. Centre of Excellence on Water and Climate Resilience
- e. IWRM in small islands

2. Parlamentarian processes in 6 points

- i. place of water in political agenda
- ii. SDGs to foster collaboration
- iii. renew existing legislations
- iv. implement Paris Agreement and other climate commitments
- v. promote UN Water Conference
- vi. facilitate knowledge sharing



BALI YOUTH PLAN AND ITS RESULTS

- Bali Youth Space, with 7 sessions, 27 working group members, 73 international young professionals, 4000 young people attended
- Youth engagement in all processes: Thematic, Regional and Political
- *Bali Youth Targets*
- Inclusion in the final Synthesis session
- Young Water Sustainability Leaders Program



CONCLUSION

- unexpected number of attendees, sessions great volume of declarations at all levels, and processes
- call to be “peaceful water warriors” and 7 commitments
- special emphasis on non-conventional water resources, technology, knowledge sharing and finance
- including source-to-sea approaches, blue economy benefits
- call to create hydro-diplomatics
- handover the co-organization of the 11th World Water Forum: Saudi Arabia (2027)
- Milestone in youth engagement and empowerment
