


- Nature conservation organisation active around the globe

# Sturgeon migration corridors and habitats





- Studies on making dams passable for sturgeon
- Data on spawning, nursing & wintering river habitats collected
- → Implement technical solution for Iron Gates
- **→** Establish accessible basin-wide habitat inventory
- → Protect known habitats

# Viable populations



- → Establish captive brood stock for 4 sturgeon species in AT and HU
- → Release 1,6 Mio sturgon juveniles in the Danube in 7 countries (AT, HU, SK, SL, BG, RO, UA)











## Improve governance framework for conservation













Declaration "Achieving functional biodiversity in the Danube-Carpathian Region by mainstreaming ecological connectivity" (2022)

- Strengthen management of existing protected areas and support the designation of additional ones
- Apply 'do no significant harm'
- Prioritise ecological connectivity in projects, plans
- Build capacity, transboundary cooperation, civil participation and public engagement
- National level: inter-sectoral, transnational cooperation, allocation of EU funds, mainstreaming sectoral policies
